Two domains

God is in control of our lives or we experience chaos.

Two kingdoms. The world and the kingdom of God.

Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

1 John 2:15

Two rulers. The individual and God. I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me.

Galatians 2:20

Christians have denied the world to live for the kingdom of God. *He died* for all, so that they who live might no longer live for themselves, but for *Him who died and rose again on their behalf.* 2 Cor 5:15

Christians seek the city of God to come. Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth passed away, and there is no longer any sea. And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, made ready as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne, saying, "Behold, the tabernacle of God is among men, and He will dwell among them, and they shall be His people, and God Himself will be among them."

Christians bow down to the rule of God. so that at the name of Jesus EVERY KNEE WILL BOW, of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and that every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Therefore, the home is where children first learn to deny the individual in order to fit into the kingdom of God.

Unless we repent we will only add to the chaos of the world.
